

Academy Awards® Accredited International Short Film Festival Short Shorts Film Festival & Asia 2016 Call for Entries opens on August 1 (Sat)

Short Shorts Film Festival & Asia (SSFF & ASIA), the first Academy Awards® accredited film festival in Japan and one of Asia's largest international short film festivals, will begin accepting submissions for its 2016 edition on August 1, 2015 (Sat).

The Call for Entries spans multiple competitions: **Official Competition** (International, Asia International, Japan), the environmentally themed **Save the Earth! Competition**, the cutting-edge **CG Animation Competition** and the **Music Video Competition**, which presents uniquely cinematic MVs. One Best Short Award is awarded for each of the three categories in the Official Competition, and the Grand Prix is chosen from among these Best Short Award winners. The film that wins the Grand Prix will be eligible for nomination for the annual Academy Awards® the following year.

Over 5,000 works from more than 100 different countries and regions were submitted for consideration for the 2015 edition of the festival. This festival is, and will continue to be, a gateway for filmmakers of the future.

About Short Shorts Film Festival & Asia (SSFF & ASIA)

SSFF & ASIA is a qualifying film festival for the annual Academy Awards® and one of Asia's largest international short film festivals. Actor Tetsuya Bessho founded the festival in the Harajuku neighborhood of Tokyo in 1999, with the aim of introducing Japanese audiences to short film – a genre of film that many Japanese were unfamiliar with. At this first edition of the festival, six short films by George Lucas – the famed creator of "Star Wars" – directed back in his student days were screened. We have received support from this maestro director every year thereafter. In 2001, the festival was named officially as Short Shorts Film Festival, and in 2004 received official accreditation by the annual Academy Awards®.

The same year, Short Shorts Film Festival Asia (SSFF ASIA, co-organized with Tokyo Metropolitan Government) was founded with the intention to highlight films from Asia, including those from Japan. To this day, the two festivals are held together as Short Shorts Film Festival & Asia, which has grown to become the largest short film festival in the region. Building off of strong connections with festivals all over the world, SSFF & ASIA has worked not just to show Japanese audiences a wide variety of films from across the world, but has also endeavored to bring Japanese short films closer to audiences the world over. The line up includes the officials competitions, as well as competitions themed around "music," "environment" and "CG animation," and various other programs spanning many categories.

The Official Competition consists of three categories: International, Asia International, Japan. A Best Short Award is awarded for each category and the Grand Prix is chosen from among the three Best Short Award winners. The Grand Prix winning short film will be eligible for nomination for the annual Academy Awards® the following year.

(2) Save the Earth! Competition

The "STOP! Global Warming Competition" was created in 2008 in collaboration with Team-6%, a national energysaving campaign initiated by the Japanese Ministry of Environment. In 2013, we changed the name to "Save the Earth! Competition," and have continued to gather excellent short films with themes relating not only to global warming, but also to various other environmental issues such as recycling, pollution, conservation and global warming.
