Which film captured the hearts of the audience this year!? SSFF & ASIA 2025 Audience Awards, Most Viewed Awards and Best Actor Awards were Announced

SSFF & ASIA 2025, one of Asia's largest international short film festivals and an Academy Awards® accredited festival, concluded on June 30.

The festival announced the winners of the Audience Award—chosen by audience votes from the nominees in the Live Action Competition's International, Asia International, and Japan categories—as well as the Best Actor Award, recognizing the most captivating performances, and the Most Viewed Award, given to the most-watched film at the Online Grand Theater.

For the Audience Award, the following films received the most support from audiences at the Tokyo venue and Online Grand Theatre: International Category: "I See You" (New Zealand), directed by Briar March, Asia International Category: "Dandelions Girl" (Iran), directed by Azadeh Meshizadeh, Japan Category: "NOVA", directed by Yuma Terada.

The Best Actor Award went to: International Category: Amal Omran for her performance in "Future is Panorama" (Germany), Asia International Category: Jo Han-chul for his role in "TRAP" (Korea), Japan Category: Miyu Yoshimoto for her performance in "ABYSS".

Additionally, the Most Viewed Award was presented to 10 films, including the Grand Prix / George Lucas Award winner Torn Pantyhose, for being the most watched among the competition films streamed online. 








Audience Award International Category

Believing she is lifeless, Kubar's father forces everyone to rewrite the story to save his son from consequences.




[NOVA]

Best Actor Award International Category



Award: Amal Omran [Future is Panorama]

When Siham, an immigrant in Germany, discovers her daughter is hiding from danger at the hands of right-wing terrorists, she plunges into a desperate quest to save her, despite police inaction.

<Reason for award>Amal Omran's Portrayal embodies the complexity of a working immigrant mother: tough, tired, and devoted beyond measure. The camera rarely leaves her, appearing in nearly every scene, and it is through these close-ups that she brings not only her fear and desperation but also the anguish of her daughter on the other end of the phone. Her portrayal is emotionally layered, and the character's journey feels so authentic and relatable. Omran carries the entire film with remarkable presence, her expressions showing exhaustion, resilience, and maternal love.

Best Actor Award Asia International Category

On a dark night, taxi driver Young-ho picks up a suspicious passenger heading to a reservoir. The passenger's cryptic

remarks unsettle Young-ho.

<Reason for award>Jo Han-chul delivers a chilling, masterfully layered performance in The Trap. Presenting a likable, soft-spoken driver whose warmth hides something far more dangerous, he plays this duality with precision. His small physical gestures, checking the mirror, tapping the steering wheel, and slight shifts in expression, reveal emotions that words alone cannot express. This performance demands not only technical skill but also emotional control and incredible expression. Jo Han-chul handles it with quiet brilliance, keeping the audience captivated until the very last moment.

Best Actor Award Japan Category

<Reason for award> In Abyss, the performance of Miyu Yoshimoto as Uta portrays a character with a dark and complex human form. It's wonderful how this dark side is believable and portrayed as a natural aspect of her personality throughout all of her acting. Miyu Yoshimoto brings precision and control to one of the most intimate scenes, where her character uses her body not as a weakness, but as a means of agency. With restrained vulnerability after the intimate act, her face and emotions through her eyes tell everything. She embodies emotional contradictions, which are difficult to transmit as an actor: calculating yet caring, dark yet radiant, composed yet raw.
