Will Be Considered for the U.S. Academy Awards® Short Film Categories.

Short Shorts Film Festival & Asia (SSFF & ASIA), one of the largest international short film festivals in Asia and an Academy Awards® accredited festival, begins accepting submissions for its 2026 edition starting Friday, August 1. In 2025, film submissions are accepted through "LIFE LOG BOX (LLB)," a rights management platform operated by Visual Voice that specializes in content and data asset management for short films. Every submitting creator automatically receives a digital wallet, enabling them to participate in upcoming Web3 services on the platform, including NFT-based voting and content trading. This initiative aims to develop into a DAO (Decentralized Autonomous Organization) community, enabling the film festival, creators, and audiences to interact directly, while utilizing blockchain technology to ensure transparent and automated management of rules, budgeting, and voting processes. SSFF & ASIA offers a groundbreaking, first-of-its-kind initiative in Japan that opens up limitless possibilities for creators, starting with the simple act of submitting a film.

A Chance for Creators to Rise to Stardom in the World of Film and Video

For SSFF & ASIA 2026, submissions are accepted from both Japan and overseas across a wide range of categories, including Live Action, Non-Fiction, and Animation—each with the award-winning films eligible for recommendation to the following year's Academy Awards® Short Film categories. Additional categories include the *Cinematic Tokyo* competition, focusing on works themed around Tokyo; the *U-25 Project*, open to young creators aged 25 and under residing in Japan; and *BRANDED SHORTS*, which highlights branded films created by companies and local governments.



Submissions of vertical format works are on the rise

We are actively seeking submissions of eye-catching "vertical" video works.

In each category, we are also actively seeking submissions based on themes and genres such as "Food," "Art," "Vertical Format," "Horror," and "Comedy" in preparation for special features at the 2026 festival. The BOOK SHORTS Award accepts not only short stories but also comics and screenplays as eligible entries.

Short videos released on social media platforms like YouTube and TikTok are also eligible for nomination. In past festivals, we have created various award opportunities beyond the main categories, including the SHIBUYA DIVERSITY AWARD for works themed around diversity; the "Save the Earth! Environment

Minister's Award" for films addressing environmental issues; the "HOPPY HAPPY AWARD" for works that best embody the spirit of *HAPPY!*/発幸; and the "J-WAVE SOUND OF CINEMA Award" for films where music, singing, voices, sounds, or instruments play a unique and effective role. These awards have opened up many chances for recognition and further opportunities for creators.

We look forward to receiving submissions from filmmakers around the world for the 2026 festival!

Shortlists for Live Action, Non-Fiction, and Animation categories will be announced on the website at the end of the second month following each submission month. The final selected works will be chosen from the shortlisted entries.

(Short Shorts Film Festival & Asia)



Actor Tetsuya Bessho, a member of the Screen Actors Guild (SAG) in the United States, founded the

American Short Shorts Film Festival in 1999 out of a desire to introduce the "short film" genre he encountered in the U.S. to Japan as a new form of visual storytelling.

In 2001, the festival was renamed the Short Shorts Film Festival (SSFF) and grew into a global celebration of short films. In 2004, SSFF was officially recognized as an Academy Awards® accredited festival. That same year, with the goal of promoting new Asian visual culture and nurturing emerging young filmmakers, the Short Shorts Film Festival Asia (SSFF ASIA), co-hosted with the Tokyo Metropolitan Government, was launched. Today, the festival is collectively known as SSFF & ASIA.

To commemorate its 20th anniversary in 2018, the Grand Prix award was renamed the George Lucas Award, honoring the famed director. The following January, the festival held the "Short Shorts Film Festival in Hollywood" as a special anniversary event.

Starting with the 2019 festival, the Academy Awards® recommendation slots expanded to include four winners from the International, Asia International, Japan, and Non-Fiction categories. From 2022, the award in the Animation category was added, bringing the total to five films eligible for nomination to the Academy Awards® Short Film categories the following year.

SSFF & ASIA continues to support young creators through its festival activities.
